Home: CV Firebirds vs. Away: ONT Reign

### Pre-Game

The Reign have been hot over the past couple months. They are 7-3-0-0 in the last 10 games. They briefly were in first place in the Pacific, but are now in 2<sup>nd</sup> place tied in points with 1<sup>st</sup> place Eagles. Tonight is the last game of a 6-game road trip. Their top 5-point leaders are AHL veterans. The veteran depth is important for the Kings who are competing for a playoff spot in the NHL. The Reign are anchored in net by veteran Phoenix Copley and back up Erik Portillo. Erik should be a primary as he is one of the top goalies in the AHL. Outside of Portillo, there are no individual players in AHL stat rankings. Their key to their success is staying out of the penalty box and having a strong penalty kill when someone does get into the sin bin.

The Firebirds are living up to their name as they are on fire as of late. They are on a 6-game winning streak. They have not trailed in the last 12 regulation periods, which is tied with another stretch from earlier this season. The change is in the defense. The Firebirds are doing a better job of get sticks in lanes, clearing pucks out of the dangerous areas, taking away passing angles, clearing out or marking opponents attempting to screen their goalie, and most important better handling of the puck in the defensive zone. It doesn't hurt to get off to fast starts to forced their opponents to chase the game. Tonight, they will be without Jacob Melanson as he has been recalled to the Kraken for the injured Ben Meyers.

## Head-to-Head

The teams met for the first time a few weeks ago. The Reign slipped by with a 3-2 win. Historically, both teams play equally, and that will be important as the last 5 games head-to-head will be played in the last two months of the season. The Firebirds need to stay out of the penalty box and continue the same winning strategy they have been using during this winning streak. The Reign are going to have the same line up as a couple weeks ago. Expect the Reign to try to draw some penalties to get an advantage. The teams are separated by 4-point in the standings, and as cross-town rivals, expect a physical close game.

### 1<sup>st</sup> Period

The Firebirds had the first push, but the Reign trapped the Firebirds in the defensive zone. After an icing and failure to get the puck out of the zone, Nikita Alexandrov made pass behind the goal that a Firebirds defender missed. Glenn Gawdin got it in the slot and sniped it home for the first goal. After bending and not breaking, the Firebirds turn to trap the Reign. On a pass to no one, Eduard Sale got the puck in the middle of the ice and fired it home from inside the left circle to tie the game.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Period

The Firebirds owned the period as the ice tilted their way. They outshot the Reign 13 to 2. The only thing they didn't do was score.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Period

The ice remained tilted to the west. Not sure if the recent earthquakes had anything to do with it. The Reign had control, and Cole Guttman scored at the 2:35 mark. The Firebirds had to take chances and push forward when they had opportunities. With 3.5 minutes left, the Firebirds pulled the goalie, and it paid off. John Hayden scored in the paint on a nice pass from Logan Morrison. The Firebirds had a few more chances to take the lead.

### OT

The Reign won the face off, but the Firebirds were able to steal the puck. Mitchell Stephens made a power move to the net, but couldn't put it home. The Reign then went on a 2 on 1, and Nikita Alexandrov put the puck home to win the game.

### Post-Game

Another 1 goal win for the Reign. A hard-fought game on both sides. The young Firebirds with some players out with injury or recalled to the Kraken did well to get a point against a top team in the league. Firebirds only had coincidental penalties so they never gave the Reign a chance on the power play. The Reign play the Eagles tomorrow night in clash of the top teams in the Pacific division. The Firebirds get some rest and will play the Eagles next Wednesday.

**Interesting Firebirds stats this year to date:**

- 5 games in row (15 periods) that the team never trailed in regulation.
- 2 different Firebirds had a hat-trick on back-to-back nights: Jagger Firkus (vs. BAK 11/15/25) and Jacob Melanson (vs ABB 11/16/25)
- Carson Rehkopf got a hat trick (vs JS 1.21.26)
- Two goalies have an assist in the season – first time since inaugural season. Kokko has 2 assists.
- The line of J.R. Avon, Logan Morrison, and Jagger Firkus scored at least one goal 9 games in a row (11/7/25-11/28/25).
- Goalie shutouts:

- Nikke Kokko got his first regular season shutout. (vs. Gulls 5-0 11/28/2025).
- Victor Östman got his second regular season shutout (vs. Gulls 4-0 1/17/2026)
- Jack LaFontaine got a shutout (vs Canucks 3-0 1/18/26)
- Victor Östman and Jack LaFontaine got shutouts on back-to-back nights. A first in Firebirds history.
- 12 game-streak where the Firebirds have scored 3 goals in a game (Started vs Col 11/5/25 – 12/6/25).
- 4-6-1-0 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> game on back-to-back nights.
- 5-5-0-0 when playing a team back-to-back with day(s) off in-between.
- 148 minutes and 58 seconds in a row without letting the other team score a goal. (Tex 2/14/26, SD 1/17/26, ABB 1/18/26, SJ 1/21/26). This is a new franchise record.
